## Armenia wins and flies away

**I**t was a beautiful round with three top matches offering some spectacular games.

Armenia won again, this time against China who dared to approach them on a threatening one point distance. However, this match didn't start well for the winners. After two hours of play they didn't have any promising position and Akopian seemed to be in trouble. Zhang Zhong went for a mating combination and won a piece, but was suddenly faced with a chain of passed pawns. Surprisingly he lost a thread, was obliged to give back a piece, then to give another one for remaining passed pawn and finally lost. Other three games ended in a draw, but Aronian was two pawn ahead in an endgame with rook and opposite colour bishops which he didn't manage to win. The odds on their final win are dropping down each day on Betson on line. Tomorrow they will be under 1,0, I'm sure.



France and USA drew, but French players missed a lot of chances in this match. The final result could have been even 3,5:0,5.

Russia finally won convincingly (3:1) an important match thanks to the quick victory of Svidler against Volokitin which put them in a comfortable position. Ivanchuk and Kramnik made a quick draw, Grischuk was better against Karjakin but without final punch. At the end it was Bareev to score another full point for Russia after a long battle in the endgame. It seems now that it wasn't just a symbolic gesture when, during the opening ceremony, Ukrainian team gave back the Hamilton-Russell trophy won in Calvia.

The greatest step forward was made by Czech Republic who cashed 3,5 points against Slovenia. Cuba and India played 2:2, as did Croatia and Greece. Uzbekistan won against Germany 2,5:1,5. Georgia, Azerbaijan, Hungary and Netherlands won 3:1 against respectively Turkey, Norway, Slovakia and Indonesia and are again close to the top.

Italian teams were rather successful. «A» team won 3:1 against Kyrgystan, «B» team defeated Luxembourg with 2,5:1,5, only «C» suffered a catastrophe against Morocco. It was 0:4!

The standing on the top is now: Armenia 29,0, China 27,0, Russia and Czech Republic 26,5, France 26,0, USA 25,5, Uzbekistan and Cuba 25,0, Ukraine, India, Israel, Romania, Georgia, Hungary, Azerbaijan and Denmark 24,5 and so on.

Top pairings for round 11 are: Armenia-Czech Republic, China-France, USA-Russia, Uzbekistan-Cuba, Romania-Georgia, Azerbaijan-Ukraine, Hungary-Denmark and India-Israel. Tomorrow we shall witness another Italian derby. It will be Italy «A» against Italy «B», this time.

By women Ukraine and Russia continue their lonely run for gold increasing the gap after each round. Now they are already almost a whole match ahead of their escort.

Yesterday their victims were Georgia and Bulgaria. The most interesting result in these two matches was a win of Stefanova (black) against Kosteniuk. China won 2:1 against Armenia, and France and USA finished in the same friendly way as their colleagues 1,5:1,5, as did Croatia and Romania as well.

An important step forward was made by Greece, they won 2,5:0,5 against Lithuania. Two victories with maximum result were achieved by India and Poland against respectively Mongolia and Colombia. Italia «A» won 2:1 against Tajikistan, but Italia «B» lost with the same result to Iceland.

The situation on the top is now: Ukraine 23,0, Russia 22,5, China 20,5, Georgia 20,0, Bulgaria, Greece and India 19,5, Romania, USA, Armenia, France and Slovenia 19,0 and so on. Top pairings for round 11 are: Bulgaria-Ukraine, Georgia-Russia, China-Greece, India-Romania, USA-Slovenia and France-Armenia.

Do I have to remind You which team won all his matches up to now? I think not.

# The world of arbiters 83 years ago in Turin

**A**rbiters perform a very important task in all matches and in the 37th chess Olympiad the dedicated services of many senior and experienced arbiters have ensured the smooth running of the tournament. In an interview with Dr. Hesham Elgendy, deputy chief arbiter, we got details of the arbiters work and responsibility.

“The match arbiters check the results and obtain signature from team captains and all the results are meticulously checked with score sheets. We ensure that all results are verified and we have an excellent system in place. The results are then given to the Pairing Committee. The arbiters organization in Olympiad includes a chief arbiter, Geurt Gijssen, and two deputy chief arbiters, myself and Franca Dapiran, deputy arbiter for women’s Olympiad. There is a team of about 120 arbiters and I am also in the Arbiters Committee for tournament rules and regulations. I started as senior arbiter in Elista Olympiad and at Istanbul I was deputy arbiter. I am happy to say that playing conditions are ideal and we have had the best of equipments as well. We also need some program to update the players about the rules & regulations and the latest developments. I have translated 3 times the FIDE rules in Arabic which have been distributed to the Arab world.”



## Chess in Czech Rep.

“We have lots of chess activity in our country” said Grandmaster David Navara, top board of the Czech team at the chess Olympiad.

“The most famous czech open, which attract 2000 chess players, is held in Prague and is the biggest Swiss open chess tournament of the world. We have many strong juniors and we need higher category tournaments for the elite players. Mr. Pavel Matocha is my manager and he is working to bring bigger events to Czech. He also organized my matches against top players like Karpov, Korchnoi, Alexey Shirov and perhaps with Boris Gelfand in August. There are 19 grandmasters and 61 international masters and 179 rated players: this is quite a good achievement with a population of 10 million. Though we are missing some of our top players, we are satisfied with our result so far, but the final three rounds are most important and we need a good finish. We have many league matches between clubs on 8 boards and they are played in 11 rounds and played all the year.

We are hoping to attain greater heights in world arena and presently we are 20th in country rankings. There is a big chess tradition in the country and in 1982 we were runnerup and it was a exceptional result.”

**I**n 1923 Esteban Canal, born in Peru but of Venetian origin, was living in Turin, where he was considered the leading master in Piedmont. On 23 March during a tour of Italy, Alexander Alekhine played a blindfold simul in Turin against four groups of strong amateurs, winning all games after four hours of play.

That evening the great Russian Master was opposed to Canal. A large group of chessplayers prepared to watch in a special hall, near the room where the game was played at the “Caffè Nazionale”.

Five past nine in the evening and you can hear a pin drop. Alekhine picks up two pawns of different colour: master Canal obtains White and makes the first move: an Italian Game.

But with his inexhaustible imagination he tries to conquer the e3 square for his Knight that, after moving his Ra8 to e8 or f8, will give him a very good position. 23.Qc4 fxe4 24.Rxe4 White’s last two moves frustrate Black’s plan: to carry through his attack he had to sacrifice his b6 pawn. In any case the occupation of e4 with the Rook, has strengthened White’s King’s position, so Black had to change his plans. 24...Ng5 25.Rh4 Qg6 26.Kh1 c5 27.Qe2 Re8 A new charge, menacing a central attack. 28.Be3 h6 If 28...e4

It was necessary to accept the complications offered by 29.Ng4. Being without sufficient training and tired by the vicissitudes of the day, I wasn’t willing to overload my brain with too many complicated variations. At 6 a.m. (it was already sunrise) I was already sure that it was impossible to change the result, the game being draw by force, and I suddenly fell asleep. I played 81.Ke5 being sure I had played 81.Kxd5. My opponent’s astonishment brought me back to reality. Too late: the game now was absolutely lost. 81...d4 82.g6 d3 83.g7 d2 84.g8Q d1Q With about another fifteen moves, that we didn’t sign, and after half an hour’s play against sleepiness, we reached more than one hundred moves. Then, it being impossible to stop the promotion of the “c” pawn, I was forced to resign this nine hour long game.



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
